**Historic Mural
Unveiling
July 4th—12pm
Lion's Shelter
Riverside Park**

A project of the
Miles City Preservation Commission
&
Custer County Historical Society

The 8' x 14' mural, "A Soldier's View", will be hung on the backside of the Riverside Park Lion's Shelter, facing what was the Ferry Landing on the Tongue River, before it was rechanneled in 1907.

The 1878 view of Miles City was painted by Hermann Stieffel, Soldier Artist of the West, a Private in Company K of the 5th Infantry at Fort Keogh. When General Nelson Miles selected the permanent site for Fort Keogh, steam-boats began arriving with supplies for the new Fort and the community. The civilians moved to the east bank of the Tongue River, clustered around the Ferry Landing, which is now Riverside Park.

This is the view that Pvt. Stieffel, depicts in his watercolor, "A Soldier's View". Although he was not a trained artist, the details in his paintings give us a view of life in the frontier west. The original is located in the Forbush Memorial Library in Westminster, Mass., hometown of General Miles.

HISTORY OF THE BLUE STAR MEMORIAL MARKER

The Blue Star Memorial Marker Project was inaugurated by the New Jersey Garden Clubs in 1944 as a fitting memorial to the service people who have fought for our country.

The name was taken from the Blue Star in the Service Flag in honor of the men and women serving in the Armed Forces. The program has spread across our nation.

The men and women in our Armed Forces fly our skies, sail our seas, and guard our shores, ensuring our safety. We want them to know that we are all aware of their services and sacrifices. They stand ready at a moment's notice to defend our country.

LOCAL HISTORY

Locally the Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker that was located on Highway 10 was removed during the construction of the Interstate going through Montana sometime in the 1960's. The Marker was purchased June 10th, 1953 and dedicated August 7th, 1953.

The 7'6" Memorial Marker disappeared. In addition to searching buildings; articles were put in the local paper as attempts to find it in years past. A location had to be found and approved as a qualified highway marker. Fund raisers and secured community donations (monetary and labor) to help with the cost of shipping, erecting the sign, benches and potted plants.

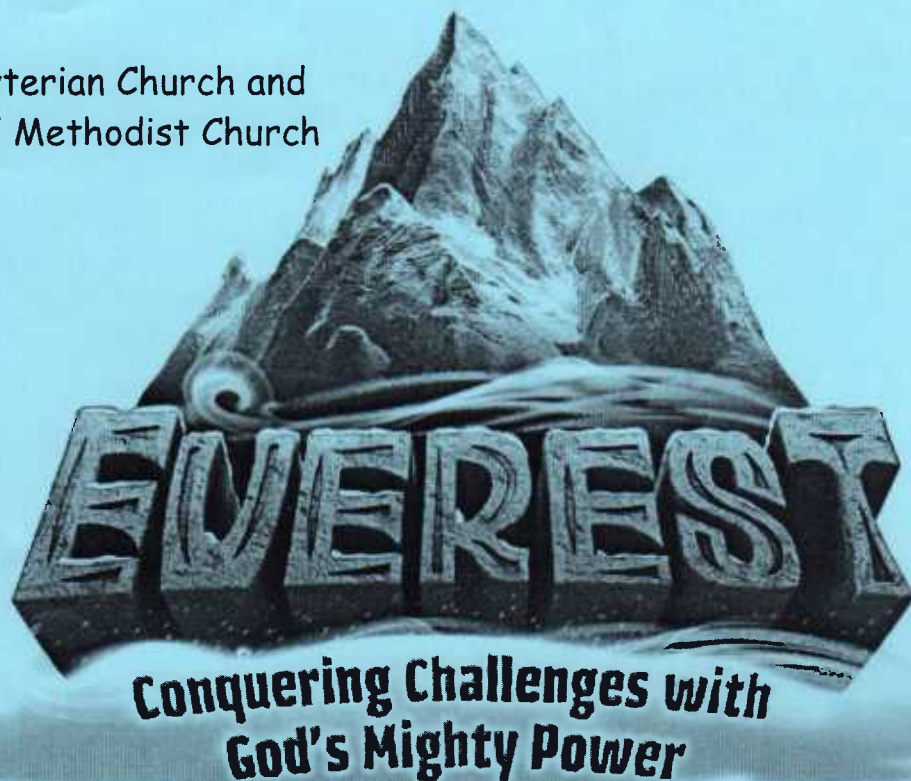
