This event is non-partisan and the public is encouraged to attend, participate, listen, and learn. The following organizations helped to sponsor this powerful panel: Custer Network Against Domestic Abuse and Assault (CNADA), Miles City chapter American Association of University Women (AAUW), and the United Christian Church of Miles City; as well as the work of numerous volunteers in and around Miles City.

In July 2017, 22 of 72 missing girls or women — or about 30 percent — were Native American, according to Montana's Department of Justice. But Native females comprise only 3.3 percent of the state's population.

On some reservations, Native American women are murdered at a rate more than 10 times the national average and more than half of Alaska Native and Native women have experienced sexual violence at some point, according to the U.S. Justice Department. A 2016 study found more than 80 percent of Native women experience violence in their lifetimes.

The panel will discuss the PAST of this epidemic, the PRESENT legislation and policies in the works that hope to stem this loss as well as current activism, and finally the FUTURE and what part we can all play in shaping a future where there are no stolen sisters.



Perseverance is "grit" or stick-to-itiveness. The decision to persevere even when challenged says a great deal about someone's character.



They follow through with what they say they will do so they are often perceived as trustworthy and reliable.

Over the last 8 years, Angela Duckworth and her colleagues (University of Penn, 2007-2015) have found that those children who possess grit and perseverance attain higher levels of education, earn higher GPAs and are more likely to graduate from high school.

These results join a mounting body of research that tells us that perseverance is a far more important predictor of future success than the prestige of a person's school/faculty.
