JUNE AND JULY

June 3-4 ... Accelerate Montana Job Site Ready Construction (hybrid), content available from May-June 2

30 hours of online, self-paced modules, plus 15 hours of hands-on instruction, equips participants with the essential skills to start a career in construction. Students will receive a tool set to keep and a Job Site Ready credential. Scholarships available to cover the \$350 registration fee. June 12-13 ... Embedding Career Development and Interpersonal Skills in the Classroom

Designed for educators across disciplines, this interactive workshop will help participants explore key topics such as career exploration, emotional intelligence, time management, effective communication, conflict resolution, and more. Participants will also gain hands-on experience with resume writing, interview preparation, and professional networking activities, while learning to foster critical skills like teamwork, professionalism, and creative problem-solving.

June 24 ... CPR and First Aid Certification

Students will receive official CPR/AED "Heartsaver" certification from Montana Health Network facilitator.

June 27 ... Youth Mental Health First Aid

Youth Mental Health First Aid is an evidence-based, early-intervention course that teaches participants about mental health and substance use challenges. Lunch period is shorter to allow for more instructional time and group discussion; lunch is provided.

online only, content available starting July 1 ... National Cinemas

An in-depth look at classic cinematic productions from the United States based on cultural and historical context. Includes a selection of films by a variety of directors and genres from the Silent Era into the present. Students will consider American films that have been affected by American culture and films that have affected American culture.

July 7-8 ... Increasing Student Engagement

How do educators get students to be the *learners* instead of being the *learned*? There are many factors that influence student engagement. Some are in an educator's control, some are not. Participants in this course will focus on student voice, classroom environment, play, and problem-based learning to support relevance and student facilitated learning, which leads to increased student success.

July 11 ... Quantum is Coming: How to Bring This Exciting Emerging Technology into K-12 Classrooms (hybrid), content available June 30 (FREE)

Quantum science and technologies are emerging STEM fields that have the potential to bring new careers and businesses to Montana, the nation, and the world. You can learn more about this exciting topic in a way that helps you bring basic concepts into your middle and/or high school classroom(s). No prior knowledge or experience is necessary.

July 17-18 ... Geology and Paleontology of Montana and Kumamoto, Japan

Participants will discover more about geology and paleontology in Montana by taking a field trip to the Carter County Museum, host of the world-famous annual Dino Shindig. They will also learn about educational resources available as part of a research trip to Japan. Teaching materials provided focus on 5th and 6th grades but can be adapted and applied to additional age groups.

July 21 ... Information Literacy (hybrid), content available from July 7-20

This course is designed to equip students with the essential skills needed to navigate the vast landscape of information resources. Students will learn how to identify credible sources, critically assess information, and apply it ethically and effectively in various contexts. The course consists of online content, plus one in-person session.

July 22-23 ...Integrate Arts to Engage Students and Deepen Understanding

Deepen understanding, while minimizing behavior issues with arts integration! In this hands-on course, you will discover a variety of project-based activities (one or more for each month of the year). While the target audience is for grades 3-6, the projects can be adapted for grades K-8 and will encompass a wide variety of subjects. Whether you are new to teaching or a seasoned veteran, you will be ready to start the school year with many new ideas to implement in your classroom! Students will be provided art materials they can take with them following course completion.

July 22-23 ... Progression of Writing

Writing is tied to every other teaching domain. Understanding the progression of writing and realistic expectations for students as, above, and below the grade level is vital in helping students become strong writers. In this hands-on course, participants will learn how each writing strand flows from grade level to grade level, as well as a variety of writing techniques instructors can use at any grade level to help improve writing in the classroom.

July 24-25 ... What They Didn't Teach You in School

According to research, teachers make an average of 1,500 decisions daily. Begin the year with tools and methods to stay ahead of your students. This hands-on course will teach you how to navigate the first week of school, daily routines, classroom behavior/management, parents (conferences), grading, disruptions, and so much more. Build a portfolio of resources tailored to your needs and start the year off right!

Thank you for joining our 2025 Summer Reading Program: Color Our World Welcome! Summer Reading Program (SRP) begins June 5 and ends July 10. All ages are invited to participate in this reading challenge. To track participants' reading achievements, children must complete Reading Logs. These can be obtained from library staff. Special events during SRP will usually be held at MCPL. Please read the "Special Events" details to learn more.

SRP is a great way to keep reading and learning a priority in children's lives. This summer we're finding ways to grow our creative and artistic skills, too. Each week, we'll read stories, make crafts or do art projects, and listen to our special guests' presentations. Two activity sessions are held weekly on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, so you call the which days and times work best for your family. Thursdays are reserved for our special guests, who will only be presenting their particular topic once each week. Please come on time and with supervision (when needed) for SRP activities and presentations. We hope to see you there!

Beading for Prizes:

Participants earn chances to win one of several grand prizes that will be awarded at the End of SRP, during the gallery orception, July 10. To earn tickets for the grand prize drawing, children must complete the independent reading goals for their age groups. Younger children may listen as others read to them if they haven't learned to read yet. Participants get to place their tickets into drawing backets of their choice. Also, they are awarded small prizes on a weekly basis as they continue to meet their weekly reading goals and progress in their summer reading.

Don't forget: gallery entries are eligible to enter in the Eastern Montana Fair, held August 20:23, 20:25.







